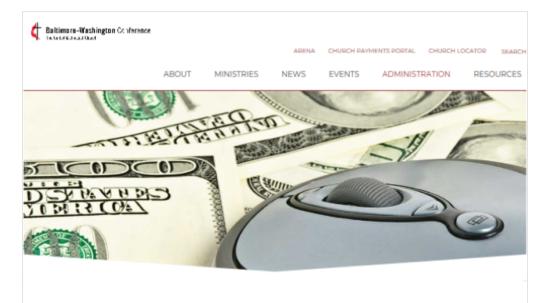

89 % STAYS WITH YOUR LOCAL CHURCH

For every dollar put in a collection plate, 89 cents stays with your local church. The remaining 11 cents supports ministries beyond the local church. About 2.9 cents of that apportionment goes to support the General Church*, which is global in its membership, mission and ministry.

About 11 cents of every dollar put in the collection plate support General Church and Conference apportionments, but together these pennies are transforming the world.

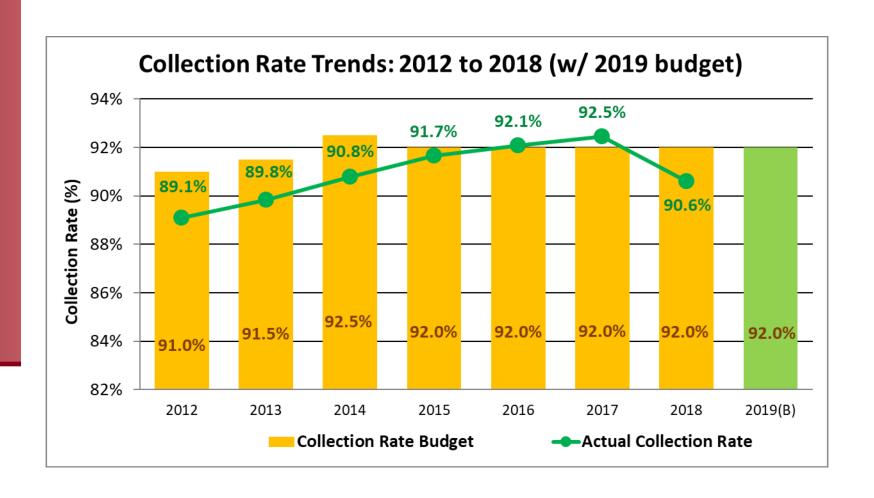

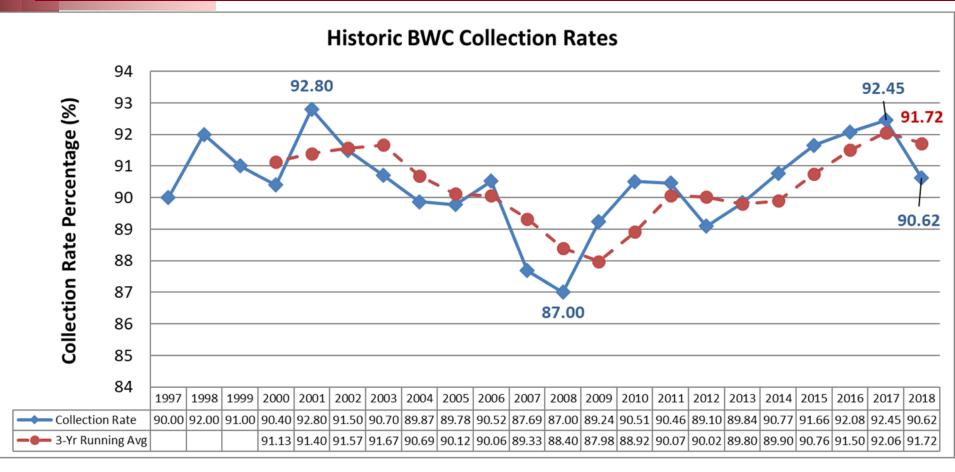
BWC Collection Rate Trends





Historic Collection Rates



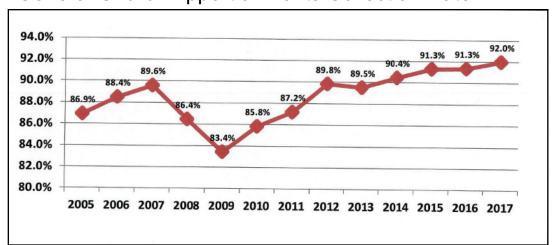


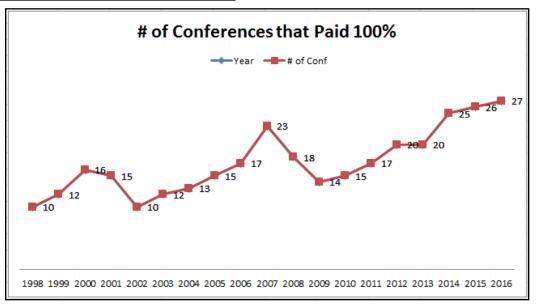
90.45% is the average collection rate over the past 20 years.
