UMW/UMM PILOT FOR CHURCH TRAINING

The BWC/UMM Partnership has received a training grant (for professional staff and resource materials) from Faith Thrust Institute. This grant will provide for I day training session in Domestic Violence and Abuse. We are asking the 8 BWC Districts to organize 2 teams to be composed with 2 women, 2 men and 2 youth/ young adult. Please reflect in membership the composition of your district. These teams will take part in the Domestic Violence and Abuse Church Training on Saturday, October 11, 2014, from 8 am through 5pm at Sharp Street Memorial United Methodist Church, 1206 Etting Street, Baltimore, Maryland. 21217. A minimum of four and a maximum of six persons are required for each team. The cost is \$10.00 which covers materials and registration.

Each church team must complete a Church Application for participation in Domestic Violence Training. The forms for each person must be returned by the new deadline August 30, 2014.


LEADERSHIP TRAINING

The Greater Washington District continues to work for the kingdom of God through its outreach ministries. We have been actively working in various areas in our local congregations, The Baltimore Annual, Conference's initiatives, as well as in global ministries through the United Methodist Women organization (UMW). GWD is fulfilling its UMW mission promise in the following ways:

The Greater Washington District had seven members from its District team to attend Mission u. Also Randall Memorial Church, Washington, DC had a youth attend Mission u, in Bethesda, Maryland from August 8-10, 2014. The district assembled approximately 200 table favors for the enrichment of the overall spirit of spiritual growth and outreach.

Many GWD churches are participating in prison ministries; some are knitting and crocheting Prayer Shawls for members of their congregations, children hospitals, nursing homes, senior citizen homes, and the sick and shut-in amongst us.

Also, GWD helped the Conference with its hospitality activity at Wesley Learning Center at Wesley Theological Seminary, for which we contributed approximately 200 assorted cookies.

Further, district churches have been creative in raising finances to meet their Conference pledges, while promoting the mission of United Methodist Women.

Additionally, GWD churches are planning their activities to include the training and execution for stopping Domestic Violence.

In the meantime, the Greater Washington District churches are incorporating many of the creative ideas they received from the United Methodist Women's Assembly in Louisville, Kentucky, April 27, 2014, in the areas of fundraising, music ministries, and Bible study.

Approximately three fourth of GWD churches are actively participating in UMW and their own local churches back to school backpack projects.
