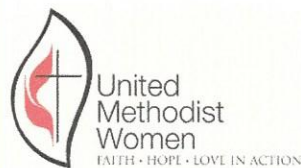

- Maintains regular contact with district treasurers.
- Sends an updated bonding list to the national office annually or whenever there is a change in the conference president, conference treasurer, district presidents, district treasurers, and the business manager or registrar of Mission u.
- Serves as the chairperson of the Committee on Finance
- Serves as a member of the executive committee

### **Other Responsibilities:**

- Works with the conference mission coordinator for education and interpretation to encourage mission giving
- Works with the conference secretary of program resources as she orders and sells materials.
- Provides resources and training annually for district treasurers.
- Ensures that all financial records are reviewed annually

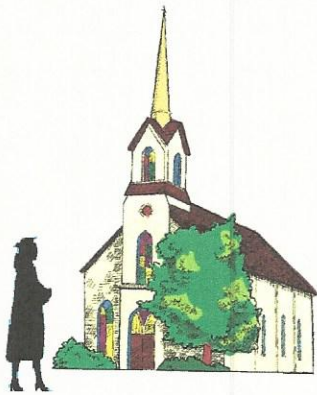

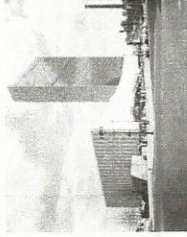

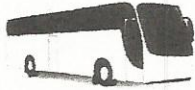
