The Baltimore-Washington Conference United Women have experienced God's grace as we addressed social justice issues on behalf of women, children and youth through mission. The work of the conference is carried out at both the local and district levels: Annapolis; Baltimore Metropolitan; Baltimore Suburban; Central Maryland; Cumberland-Hagerstown; Frederick; Greater Washington and Washington East. The 2015 BWC-UMW Annual Celebration, hosted by the Annapolis District, was a success. We gathered at Severna Park United Methodist Church and celebrated with music, church history, awards, remembrance, singing, liturgical dance and a very special guest speaker, Donna Akuamoah, Executive Secretary, International Ministries at United Methodist Women National Office. We encouraged continued giving to our United Methodist Women Projects: Baltimore Parish Work, Baltimore, MD; Epworth House Mission Project, Washington, DC; Family Crisis Resource Center, Inc., Cumberland, MD; Montgomery Avenue Women's Center, Rockville, MD; Scholarship Fund, BWC United Methodist Women; Shenandoah Women Center, Inc., Martinsburg, WV; Susanna Wesley House, Baltimore, MD; Shepherd's Staff, Westminster, MD; and YWCA Domestic Violence Counseling and Safe House, Arnold, MD. These services are inspired by 1 Thessalonians 1:3, which relates to the vision, "Turning faith, hope and love in action," on behalf of women, children and youth around the world. These services give voice to the unheard, raise up women leaders through education, empower women to move forward, show acts of service to others, and meet the needs of those without a voice.

Social Justice Issues

United Methodist Women and United Methodist Men Collaboration partnership on Domestic Violence and Abuse Luncheon was held at the Baltimore-Washington Conference Annual Conference. We look forward to continued conversation around this mission for 2016.

The Charter for Racial Justice Seminar was held May 15-17, 2015. The theme was "Making Racial Justice Happen!" This was a seminar presented by nine conferences (Baltimore-Washington Conference, Eastern Pennsylvania, Greater New Jersey, Peninsula-Delaware, New York, Susquehanna, Virginia, West Virginia, Western Pennsylvania Conference). Voter registration is the outcome from the seminar.

Blanche Powell Memorial United Nations Seminar for the BWC was held in New York City on November 22-24, 2015, with the focus on Wealth Inequality. The issues emphasis was on economic justice as it effects everyday life situations.

National United Methodist Women Leadership Development Days are a three day weekend filled with practical, hands-on workshops, networking and experience-based knowledge on mission. I attended the National Seminar in Chicago, IL. Several leaders from the Baltimore-Washington Conference attended St. Louis, MO for training. Other training venues include Tempe, AZ and Lake Junaluska, NC. Training is a key component to spiritual growth and mission education.

- The annual Administrative Planning Retreat is scheduled for January 2, 2016, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and will be held at the Conference Center in Fulton, MD. Kindly bring your bright ideas.

First, a report on the Baltimore-Washington Conference 2015 District Mission Today Unit Competition: The Washington East District United Methodist Women won the Competition and was the recipient of the beautiful first place Mission Today Crystal Award. Second and third place winners respectively were the Annapolis District and the Baltimore Suburban District. Our heartiest congratulations go to each of these three districts and to their local units which qualified in the Mission Today Unit Checklist Program! The Crystal Award will rotate annually to the district having the highest percentage of local units qualifying in the Mission Today Unit Checklist Program. In a spirit of friendly competition, the Washington East District must work to keep the Award in 2016, and we encourage all other districts to endeavor to take it away! We will see you all in the winner's circle.

In early 2016, we will circulate a document that will include various examples of how to meet requirements for each of the 18 items included on the Mission Today Unit Checklist form. The purpose for the document will be to promote a better understanding of ways that the items can be completed to ensure Mission Today Checklist certification requirements are met.

Great news! *Response* can now be obtained by digital subscription. This makes it possible to read *response*, the official magazine of United Methodist Women, on your tablet, e-reader, phone or computer. And, you can subscribe at a 15 percent discount from the printed magazine price. Check it out!

The last thought I will leave with you references local units' 2016 Pledges to Mission. The Pledge to Mission is one of the more important United Methodist Women's individual and group funding activities. This method of giving supports the United Methodist Women's global mission platform. Importantly, remember that the making of a realistic unit Pledge begins with a bottom-up approach in which each local unit works with its members to build its target Pledge. The target Pledge may also include funds anticipated from other local unit sources. Once the unit's target Pledge is decided and indicated to the district treasurer, it becomes incumbent on the unit to ensure that the Pledge to Mission is met. Accordingly, each local unit is encouraged to move quickly to establish a realistic 2016 Pledge to Mission if you have not already done so. Then, work to ensure your Pledge becomes a reality!

Finally, as the year draws to a close, I take the opportunity to thank all local units and districts for their great work in the name of mission. Let us all be mindful of our upcoming 2019 anniversary celebration, and continue to pursue ways we can make our celebration a reality now and into 2019.

Well Ladies, we finally have some exciting news: we have a date for our **Maryland Legislative Advocacy Day – February 17, 2016 – so hold that date.** Ann Price and I are working with Pastor Kevin Slayton, the Advocacy Consultant for BWC, to put together a substantive program of education and advocacy on issues important to women and society in general. It will be a half day program in Annapolis, so clear your morning and early afternoon and please spread the word to all of your units. More information about the bills we will be focusing on and the registration details will follow in late December or early January.

Another exciting development announced at last night's BWC Church and Society meeting is the opening of the first health clinic in a United Methodist Church in BWC. Irance Reddix, Associate Pastor at St. Johns in Baltimore, has been working on this Faith and Health initiative for the last two years and now has her clinic open two days a week to start with. The program, called Life Bridge, from hospital to church, hopes to encourage holistic care so that patients in hospitals are followed by church clinics offering spiritual, as well as physical care. Is this something your churches might be interested in?

For those of us who attended the May Charter for Racial Justice Seminar in Blackstone, VA, check out the BWC web site on Racial Justice and Reconciliation gatherings held by the Greater Washington District to bring about Community Transformation. The third gathering was in October with more to be held next year. I hope to attend the next one, and hope to see some of you there. This is a working group with lots of good ideas for all of us.

I am pleased to report that we have had another successful year with our investments. During the year of 2015 we have been able to:

- Continue to support the Baltimore Parish Works each quarter with a check for \$7,500 for a total of \$30,000.
- Donate \$5,000 for interpreters for Mission u.
- Donate \$13,000 to Susanna Wesley House for the cleanup of the mold and mildew situation.
- Donate \$12,000 to the Baltimore-Washington Conference for the Scholarship Fund.
- Donate \$5,000 to Wilson Memorial to help with expenses for providing shelter for 6 women and their children to keep them from being homeless.

As of this writing we are in need of someone from the Cumberland-Hagerstown District to sit on the BWC Board of Trustees. It is essential that all districts are represented on the board. We meet two times a year – the second Tuesday of April and September at the Baltimore-Washington Conference center. If you are a member of the Investment Committee, you would need to meet two weeks after the regular meeting. However, if you are on the Nominating Committee, you only have to come to the center two times a year. Mr. Doug Potter is our Investment Advisor and we have all learned so much from being a part of this team. If you are in the Cumberland-Hagerstown district, please prayerfully consider being a Trustee.

The Baltimore Metropolitan District will continue to provide items for prison ministry to satisfy our **Purpose**.


Plans are in the making for the BWC Annual Fall Celebration in our district. For the 2019 UMW Legacy event, ideas are being shared and taken into consideration.
