### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

United Methodist Women are on the forefront leading changes, leading with fresh wind for social justice on behalf of women, children and youth. "Whoever speaks must do so as one speaking the very word of God; whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. To him belong the glory and the power forever and ever." 1 Peter 4:11.

We embrace the Purpose for UMW through the conference theme-"Embracing Mission and Outreach through Love in Action." Our vision, faith, hope and love in action for United Methodist Women personifies that we empower women, children, and youth through mission. These activities will strengthen the quality of their lives as they help others. All districts are to make conference initiatives come alive in the people they serve within the various communities through hands-on mission. Our initiatives are:

• Charter for Racial Justice-Voter Registration, community education and learning to live out the Charter.

- Domestic violence Encouraging churches to participate in community activities and have small group discussions. Creating a Church Domestic team with six people to promote awareness and community education.
- Disabilities -Inform churches to conduct an accessibility audit. To meet the needs of those who may be challenged in health, hearing, sight and physical disabilities.
- Maternal Health Make sex information available for churches and schools.
- 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration-Telling the story of UMW and target younger women for membership in UMW.

The district presidents are responsible for ensuring that the conference initiatives are passed on to the local churches for implementation. Remember, that we are connected through a connectional system with churches and agencies. There are various resources in each district that can be used to help with mission and outreach efforts in the community such as: workshops, speakers, drama/skits, health fairs, social justice issues, discussion groups that can be used to meet the diverse needs of women, children and youth. Continue to adopt a school, child care facility and senior facility as a service project in mission.

In five months the conference and districts will host their annual celebrations which will highlight the accomplishments achieved in living out the initiatives. This requires a greater attention to gathering data and accurately reporting the mission events/stories; identifying active/inactive units; directories with correct emails and phone numbers; monitoring the progress on paying mission pledges to the BWC-UMW. The districts are encouraged to work closely with the local units to help them understand how pledge funds are used around the world to serve others.

Special emphasizes are to be placed upon the role of the Nominations Committee to be inclusive in the selection process for officers. Each district shall have a committee with 3-5 members that reflects the composition of its membership.

The conference Nomination's Committee shall have representation from each district to serve as a team member. Please consider recommending a person for this great responsibility. It would be helpful to have a chart that depicts the date elected, years served and the end year for each officer.

### The President (Cont'd.)

The code of ethics guiding principles for finance officers' best practice states that finance officers (treasurers) should avoid any conflict of interest by having relatives handle funds for the leadership team. As a conference we support this principle.

The BWC-UMW are involved in the farewell activities for Mrs. Barbara Matthews, wife of Bishop Marcus Matthews. The theme: **From our Hearts to Her Heart** will be celebrated on May 28, 2016, 1:00 pm- 4:00 pm at the Baltimore-Washington Conference Mission Center. The districts' local churches have donated 125 prayer shawls and lap covers to be sent to Africa University in Zimbabwe in honor of Mrs. Matthews' ministry as well as a love offering which will be submitted to Gilchrist Hospice, her favored charity.

We are called through our Purpose to serve women, children and youth around the world. Let's continue to work as a team in exploring avenues to address social justice issues.

It was a pleasure meeting with Erma Ellecamp from the Annapolis District, Michele Sparklin from the Baltimore Suburban District and Korla Frye from the Washington East District at our March training. At the meeting I shared five United Methodist Women Editing Guidelines:

- United Methodist Women is treated as a singular noun. Women who are part of United Methodist Women are "members of United Methodist Women," "a member of United Methodist Women" or "United Methodist Women members. INCORRECT: United Methodist Woman.
- We do not use "UMW" in publications unless it's part of a website address like: www.umwonline.org
- As of January 2013, United Methodist Women is no longer called "Women's Division." Please use "United Methodist Women" in all instances (unless speaking of the past).
- Mission Giving is United Methodist Women's primary source of fundraising and is always capitalized. Program Book, Prayer Calendar, National Mission Institutions, and Reading Program should also always be capitalized.
- Do not use the phrase "mission to," but rather "mission with" when referring to United Methodist Women's work with women, children, youth and other marginalized communities.

Also the correct logo that we should be using with United Methodist Women publications is:

Mission within United Methodist Women: United Methodist Women is synonymous with the concept of mission. Its entire emphasis is mission with a focus on spiritual and educational development of United Methodist Women members, and advocacy and service involving justice for women, youth, and children. In addition to the wonderful personal hands-on mission, and other activities carried out within conferences, United Methodist Women's core mission activities are undergirded by a structured Mission Giving program. All elements of the giving program are important, but significant emphasis is placed on the *Pledge to Mission*. Within the Baltimore-Washington Conference, we implement our mission programs quite well. It is important to recognize, though, that across all conferences, meeting of the annual *Pledge to Mission* is essential to the success of any mission program. In that regard, let us endeavor to give this Mission Giving effort our highest priority.

Education and Interpretation (Cont'd.)

<u>Mission Today Unit Checklist Competition</u>: As a reminder, the annual *BWC-UMW District Mission Today Unit Competition* is now under way. Each local Unit is encouraged to participate in the 2016 *Mission Today Checklist* to help your district compete, and possibly win one of the three prizes. The district that wins First Place will be the recipient of the rotating *Mission Today Crystal Award* for having the largest number of Units *qualifying* for Mission Today Unit Checklist certification at Gold, Silver and Bronze levels. A 2016 Mission Today Unit Competition Flyer is enclosed herein.

Annual Report Submissions: The B-W Conference UMW Leadership Team has set the following 2016 schedule for submission of Annual Reports: (1) Report submissions from UMW local units are due to responsible UMW district officers not later than September 1, 2016. (2) Report submissions from UMW district officers are due to responsible conference officers not later than September 15, 2016. (3) Report submissions from conference officers are due to other responsible conference officers not later than September 30, 2016. These deadlines refer to reports such as the Reading Program, Diversity Today Units, 5-Star Units, Mission Today Unit Checklist, Mission Today Checklist Competition, and other such reports.

Congratulations Baltimore-Washington Conference! We were able to submit our Census Data to National Headquarters, THIS YEAR ONLY, without having to comply with using the new data collection system that has been implemented. Under the new guidelines, ALL LOCAL UNITS and DISTRICTS are to input their data into the system. On April 19, the Membership Office re-opened The 2015 On-line Membership Census link to allow Conferences to input their Census Membership information. Upon receiving that email, Maria Rodriguez at the National UMW Membership Office in New York, was contacted to discuss the dilemma the Baltimore-Washington Conference UMW faced with many of the local units not having or limited by access to a computer. Again, it was explained to her that we had better results with the 2013 and 2014 collection tool. acknowledged that other Conferences faced the same problem, but this method would better serve them. However, after more discussion I was allowed to reenter what was submitted earlier, without involving EACH LOCAL UNIT or DISTRICT logging into the online data collection system.

We will have to come up with ways in which each local unit and district can get assistance with inputting their information. For more information on the new system, visit <a href="http://unitedmethodistwomen-public.sharepoint.com">http://unitedmethodistwomen-public.sharepoint.com</a>

The membership count for 2015, submitted to National UMW for BWC-UMW was 6,624, with all eight districts reporting. For 2014, the membership count was 4,613, with five of the eight districts reporting. We have made progress.

Thank you District MNO's and Local Unit MNO's for your hard work. I know there are a lot of concerns about electronic usage and reporting, however, we will strive to continue to find ways to meet the challenges that technology poses, while being inclusive and moving forward.

#### **BWC-UMW BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

The BWC-UMW Board of Trustees met on Tuesday, April 26, 2016, at the Conference Center. The investments are doing very well with an overall profit of 3% while money in the banks are only getting one tenth of 1% and War Bonds a little more than that. Because of our continued success (thanks to the direction of Doug Potter from Lombard Securities), we are able to donate the following:

- \$12,000 for the Scholarship Fund
- \$5,000 for Mission u to cover the costs for interpreters
- \$1,920 to cover the cost for each district to pay for one Youth to attend
   Mission u
- We give Baltimore Parish Works \$7,500 each quarter for their various projects.
- We are strongly considering donating \$20,000 to Susanna Wesley House.
  You may not know this but SWH consists of two buildings and one is in dire
  need of repair as it is deteriorating. The cost to restore this is \$3,000,000
  and they want to hire a fund-raiser to do a feasibility study to determine if
  there are trusts and foundations that might help us. Several members of the
  Board of Trustees, me included, went to visit the SWH. The current building
  #609 is in excellent condition and now has a new partner to rent the facility.
  That partner is the Board of Child Care.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, September 13, 2016, at the Conference Center. We still do not have a representative for the Cumberland/Hagerstown area. Michelle Propst is our member from the Frederick District and if someone from Cumberland/Hagerstown would be willing to step up as their representative, Michelle would be more than glad to meet them and drive the rest of the way to the Conference Center. Thank you for considering this.
