Sixty plus women from the Baltimore-Washington Conference UMW attended the Northeast Jurisdiction Meeting on June 16-18, 2016. The theme: "A Fresh Wind Blowing" was the highlight for each gathering. The opening session was spectacular beginning with flying kits from various conferences held by their presidents and team members showing special art works. The BWC-UMW kite decorations consisted of logos from the eight districts, the names of each district president, and also the Conference leadership team members At the NEJ-UMW, Colleen Cates was elected as a board member to the National UMW Board of Directors and Mikele Haskins-Delmore was elected Vice President for the NEJ Leadership Team (2016-2020). We are very proud of their achievement.

As Conference UMW President, I participated in the Northeastern Jurisdiction for the United Methodist Church, July 12-15, 2016 and witnessed the outgoing celebration for Bishop Marcus Matthews/Mrs. Barbara Mathews, and the election of two black female bishops: Rev. LaTrelle Miller Easterling as the Episcopal Leader for the Baltimore-Washington Conference; and Rev. Cynthia Moore Koikoi. Our new bishops support the work of UMW.

Soon we will gather for our Annual Celebration at Towson UMC, 501 Hampton Lane, Towson, MD 21286, on October 22, 2016. The Leadership Team which consists of conference and district leaders, will play an important role in the success for our meeting. Please encourage your district and local units to participate. Districts with youth and young adults in attendance will be recognized with a special award.

The Wesley Learning Committee in partnership with Wesley Theological Seminary engaged in a mission activity with students from the Preachers' School. The students stuffed back-to-school bags that will be sent to UMCOR.

- Do not use the word "on" with dates. CORRECT: "United Methodist Women's Assembly will take place April 30-May 2." INCORRECT: "Opening worship for Assembly <u>on</u> April 30 will include a variety of worship styles."



CENSUS REPORTING UPDATE

National office will continue using the online UMW Membership Census Data Gathering Tool implemented in 2016. This tool will help National UMW to capture more information about the districts and local units in the various conferences. Sally Vonner, Assistant General Secretary, Membership & Leadership Development, attended the BWC Mission u and participated in the MNO Officer Update. She spoke to the MNO District Officers who attended the update, on the merits of the new system. She stated "the data gathered will give National UMW a total picture of the communities served." They are aware of challenges facing units, therefore, they are willing to help anyone who calls on them for help in using the new data collection system.

We will be allowed to input information in the new system as early as September. I will be asking Conference President, District Presidents and MNO Officers to partner with me to find a way to "electronically" collect data. We face a challenge, however, I am confident we will succeed. Once the information has been collected, it will be a matter of updating the data annually. I ask for your prayers and patience as we undertake this effort.

Committe on Nominations

Leadership inherently leads to the success of any organization. It is because of effective leadership and commitment that United Methodist Women has existed for so many years. To equip and position its leaders for success, leadership training is provided by the national office at several locations during the fall and winter months, and locally within your districts by the conference and district leadership teams.



Throughout the year, committee members solicit nominations for potential leaders. When more than one nomination is received for the same position, the committee will review each nomination and make a proposal based upon the several factors such as term and tenure of the nominee, demographics, the age of the nominee and any factors that will provide a diversified team which represents the membership.

Forty-five days prior to the Annual Celebration, the Committee on Nominations will publish the slate of officers for your review. This slate will be presented for a vote during the Annual Celebration in October. In addition to the proposed slate, nominations may be accepted from the floor. If this occurs, the Committee on Nominations will determine the eligibility of the nominee before a vote is taken.


