Reading Assignment: This class basically a 10 hour session with a break for sleep and breakfast. The assignment is to read ALL of the required text-- The Method of Our Mission: United Methodist Polity & Organization, by Laceye C. Warner. Make note of questions that arise and we will do our best to address them as we go through the class.

IN ADDITION: Please prepare an "Organization Chart" of how your local congregation is structured —no need for names of persons, just names of the various committees, boards and groups as well as an indication of to whom they are accountable. Be prepared to answer the following questions:

- 1) Why are you structured the way you are?
- 2) What are the positive features of your structure?
- 3) What are the negative features of your structure?
- 4) As a Lay Servant, where are you located in the structure and what does that mean for your ministry?

While it is not "required" it would be good to have a copy of the <u>2016 DISCIPLINE</u>. As this will be rewritten after the General Conference of 2020 I would suggest that, if possible, you borrow rather than purchase a copy. If you can lay your hands on a copy of the <u>Book of Resolutions</u> that would also be helpful to bring along. If time permits, look through the *Table of Contents* of both and read those sections that interest you making notes of questions, "Aha!!s", and points of interest to you. **NOTE:** here is a link to FREE on-line versions of both books. https://www.cokesbury.com/book-of-discipline-book-of-resolutions-free-versions

This is NOT a time to debate any issues we may have with that polity, i.e. recent Special General Conference legislation.

Then fill out the "Certified Lay Servant and Certified Lay Speaker- Application" attaching certificates from both classes and send the packet for review and approval by the District Committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure (See ¶668.3).
