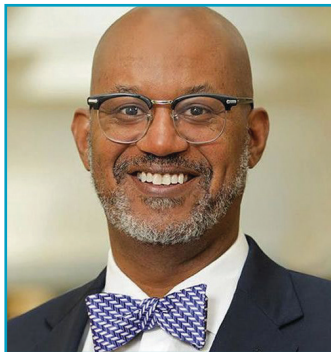

Dr. David Anderson Hooker

David Anderson Hooker (Ph.D., J.D., M.Div., M.P.H., M.P.A., A.M) for more than 30 years has utilized his training and expertise in conflict transformation by serving as mediator, community builder, scholar, and advocate. He is a former senior program associate for the National Institute for Dispute Resolution (NIDR) in Washington, D.C., and the Community Building Advisor for the William Winter Institute for Racial Reconciliation at the University of Mississippi in Oxford. Rev. Hooker currently is on the staff of JustPeace, The United Methodist Church's Center for Mediation and Conflict Transformation, and serves as the associate professor of the Practice of Conflict Transformation and Peacebuilding at the KROC Institute for International Peace Studies at the University of Notre Dame.



Hooker has also worked in Bosnia/Croatia, Cuba, Myanmar, Nigeria, Somalia, Southern Sudan, and Zimbabwe. He holds a PhD in Social Construction from Tilburg University in Tilburg Netherlands, a law degree (JD) from Emory University's School of Law, a Masters of Divinity (M.Div.) from the Candler School of Theology, Masters of Public Health (MPH) and public Administration (MPA) from the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, a Masters of Minority Mental Health from Washington University in St. Louis, and a BS from Morehouse College.
