High schoolers will have the opportunity to join an ongoing cohort following attendance at any Conference event designed for youth. Youth cohorts will focus on one of the following areas:

Focus Areas

- Annual Conference Session and Connectional Leadership. These students will discern
 and plan elements of worship and presentations to be given during the 2020 BWC Annual
 Conference Sessions in May, and some may also choose to be involved with jurisdictional
 conference.
- **Compassionate Justice.** Partner with one or more of the conference's eight social action teams and develop opportunities for youth to engage in addressing creation care (environmental justice), gender equality, gun violence prevention, immigration rights, human rights, racial justice, restorative justice, wealth equity.
- Mental Health. Building on existing initiatives like Stress Less and ROCK Cares, partner with mental health experts to develop resources and ministries that focus on improving mental health for youth.
- **Project at Your Local Church or District.** Students plan and craft a ministry initiative in their own communities with the support of a mentor.
- Young People's Ministries (YPM) Communications. Explore various mediums (social media, video, podcasts, newspaper, etc.) and develop content to be shared across the Baltimore-Washington Conference. Some content may be reporting on what is happening with youth in the BWC, others may be resources or opinion pieces.
